

How is garbage and recycling handled in Moosic?

Moosic Borough provides the refuse and recycling services for residents. The annual fee of \$190.00 is included on the Real Estate Tax bill sent to residents in the first quarter of each year. Renters should contact their landlord for questions specific to the application of their fee.

The fee covers weekly garbage and recycling (cardboard & co-mingled), grass & brush pick-up and paper fiber once a month.

Garbage is limited to five (5) 20-gallon cans per week of standard household materials.

- Excess garbage or heavy garbage may be refused.
- No construction materials, wood or Styrofoam
- No hazardous materials or paint
- No electronics, batteries or lightbulbs
- No tires or appliances
- No bodily waste, fluids or other

Recycling is limited to two (2) bin per household for cardboard (1) and co-mingled (1).

Cardboard should be broken down and any liners removed

- Materials, such as cereal boxes, cracker boxes, shipping boxes, lightweight boxes, paper towel rolls, pizza boxes are acceptable
- No paper fiber materials, such as newspapers, catalogs, magazines, phone books, computer paper, envelopes, unwanted mail, and shredded paper
- No food residue

Co-Mingled materials should be separated from garbage or cardboard receptacle

- Glass bottles and jars, aluminum and steel cans, plastic bottles (crushed with lids on) and plastic jars are acceptable
- No containers with food or fluids remaining (free of any food waste or debris)

Yard Waste materials of separated grass and leaves and small branches bounded together

- Open bins, containers and yard bags only
- Grass clippings, leaves and small branches
- No branches over 2 feet in length or 2 inches in diameter
- No plastic bags will be picked up

Paper Fiber materials picked up once a month (typically first Friday, unless Holiday)

- Newspapers, catalogs, magazines, phone books, computer paper, envelopes, unwanted mail, and shredded paper
